

SUNDAY CONNECTION

Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection but to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection.

Each of the four Gospels tells us that Jesus' empty tomb was first discovered by women. In the case of John's Gospel, the only woman attending the tomb is Mary of Magdala. Mary is simply said to have observed that the stone that had sealed the tomb had been moved, and she runs to alert Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. Her statement to them is telling. She assumes that Jesus' body has been removed, perhaps stolen. She does not consider that Jesus has been raised from the dead.

Simon Peter and the beloved disciple race to the tomb. The beloved disciple arrives first but does not enter the tomb until after Simon Peter. This detail paints a vivid picture, as does the detail provided about the burial cloths. Some scholars believe that the presence of the burial cloths in the tomb offers evidence to the listener that Jesus' body had not been stolen.

The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus—in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.

BIBLE



In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead. That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives. In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. Their experience can teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God.

Gather your family members and ask them to share what they know about the events that happened in the days after Jesus' crucifixion. Invite your family to imagine that they are among Jesus' first disciples. Reflect together on the Gospel with questions such as these:

If you had been among the first disciples who heard that the stone had been removed from Jesus' tomb and that Jesus' body was no longer there, what would you think? Recall that this experience is the first indication Jesus' disciples have that he is risen.

Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

QUESTIONS & CATHOLIC ANSWERS

There is any evidence of the Resurrection?

Four key pieces of evidence often cited as supporting the resurrection of Jesus are: the death and burial of Jesus, the empty tomb, the belief of the apostles, and the conversion of Paul. Here's a more detailed look at each point:

Jesus's Death and Burial:

The Gospels record Jesus's crucifixion and burial in a tomb, a fact acknowledged by both believers and skeptics.

The Empty Tomb:

The New Testament accounts state that the tomb where Jesus's body was placed was found empty a few days later, a detail that is central to the resurrection narrative.

The Testimony of the Apostles:

The apostles, who initially were in despair after Jesus's death, began preaching the resurrection with unwavering conviction, even facing persecution for it.

The Conversion of Saint Paul:

Saul, a persecutor of Christians, experienced a dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus, becoming the apostle Paul and a fervent advocate for the resurrection, suggesting a powerful and transformative experience.



Wills & Bequests


A Bequest, a gift of money or assets left through your will, is vital to your Parish Church and the people the Church serves. It is a unique gift and an investment in the future. By leaving a bequest you are making a lasting difference in the life of the Parish community.



Our Lady of Lourdes welcomes charitable donations made by bequest through your Will or through Trust. In remembering our Church you also leave a lasting legacy.

There are various forms of bequests that you may make. For example, the proceeds of an unrestricted bequest may be used where needed, whereas a restricted bequest specifies the use of the donation. Bequests may come in the form of a specific dollar amount, securities, real estate, tangible property, and retirement account assets. A residuary bequest allows Our Lady of Lourdes to receive all or a percentage of your estate after all obligations have been met. If a Will or Trust already exists, an amendment can be done by an attorney through a document called a codicil, which adds a new bequest.

Our Lady of Lourdes is a charitable, not-for-profit institution; therefore, all bequests are fully deductible for estate tax purposes.

Easter shows that God's plan will be fulfilled
Pope Bendict XVI

"Dear brothers and sisters, in these Easter days one often hears the words of Jesus: 'I have risen and am still with you.' Echoing this announcement, the Church exultantly proclaims: 'Yes, we are sure! The Lord is truly risen, alleluia! His glory and power are forever."

The victory of Easter, the Pope explained, makes Christ the "invisible head" of the people of God, who are "intended to grow over the centuries, until the fulfillment of the plan of salvation." "Then, the entirety of humanity will be built on him, and every existing reality will be permeated with his total victory. Then, as St. Paul writes, he will be 'the perfect fulfillment of all things,' and 'God will be all in all."

"Therefore, the Christian community rejoices because the resurrection of the Lord assures us that the divine plan of salvation is fulfilled indeed." Easter is really our hope, because through our Baptism in Christ we are raised from the death of our sins and are able to "walk without stopping to Easter eternal." And in this journey, we are not left alone, we are "supported by an awareness that the difficulties, struggles, trials and suffering of human existence, including death, are now no longer be able to separate us from him and his love."

Jesus told us, "I have risen and am still with you," and this is true in the Eucharist. "In the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the risen Lord purifies us from our sins; spiritually nourishes us and strongly supports us in the trials of life and in fighting against sin and evil."

ARE YOU AN ACTIVE PARISHIONER?

A Parish is not simply a "branch office" of the Church, nor a periodic audience of people, nor an occasional public; but it is a formally organized social group. It is a portion of a Diocese under the authority of a priest legitimately appointed to secure in virtue of his office for the faithful dwelling therein, the helps of religion.

The faithful are called parishioners, and they become parishioners by acquiring a domicile or a quasi-domicile within the geographical boundaries or territory of the Parish.

Parishioners could be active parishioners or non active parishioners, and the question of parishioner status is important because parishioners look to their Parish for many services:

parishioner tuition rates in our Catholic schools; the use of our facilities for liturgical services such as baptisms, weddings and funerals; and certification as eligible sponsors at Sacramental celebrations.

These rights and services within the church bring with them certain obligations, as in any form of community.

To be considered "active", parishioners must be registered in the parish; attend Mass faithfully; support the life of the parish by sharing time and talents in service, and sharing treasure (tithing) to build up the community. Active participation in Christian Stewardship makes you an ACTIVE parishioner.
